Cambs Historic Churches Trust (CHCT) "Ride and Stride"

On last Saturday's CHCT cycle ride, John Boocock and companions cycled thirty-five miles (in eight hours) and visited forty churches (eighteen Anglican, nine Baptist, six Methodist, four Salvation Army, and three others), from north Cambridge and a dozen villages northwards to Over and back. At the same time a dozen folk called into Castle Street on their ride or stride rounds. Our thanks to all who contributed in any way.
