## **"Science meets Faith": Can science make us better humans?**

The next in this series at Wesley Methodist Church takes places tomorrow evening (Monday 8th December), when John Bryant will discuss the subject of Bioethics.

On the other hand, the transhumanism movement wants us to be "better than well" and suggests that science can deliver that objective. How realistic are these claims and, if they are realistic, what are the ethical and social implications that arise? How do we decide what is right and what is wrong?
