From Roman forts to Victorian slums...

...discover the story of the oldest part of Cambridge on a guided walk around Castle Hill. Led by Neale Sneade who lives in St. Peter's Street, this local history walk is taking place this afternoon (Sunday 26th June). Meet at 3pm at the foot of the Castle Mound (by Shire Hall car park); the walk will cover 1.2 miles and last about two hours and end on the Quayside. It's free, but a suggested donation of £5 can be made in aid of the Museum of Cambridge. There's no need to register – just turn up at 3pm.



Strawberry Fayre at Haslingfield

The annual Strawberry Fayre organised by Haslingfield Methodist Church and the Little Owls Preschool will take this Friday (1st July), from 5.30pm until 7pm.
