Circuit service this Sunday evening (at Castle Street)

The service this evening will be a celebration of three anniversaries. First, it marks the two hundredth anniversary of the Cambridge Circuit. We also recognise long service from two of our local preachers – sixty years from John Baker, and fifty from Else Salmon. Please do come along at 6.30pm and join the celebration. There will be cake afterwards!

Message from Revd. Carole Irwin about next Sunday morning's service In the week following next Sunday, 1st and 2nd November are dates when some parts of the Christian Church celebrate All Saints' Day (1st) and All Souls' Day (2nd) – remembering and commemorating named Saints of the Church, and all the faithful departed, on the respective days. Methodists don't have a tradition of marking these two days, and understand the idea of sainthood differently from the tradition of naming particular individuals. But we do, in all sorts of ways, remember and give thanks for those who have faithfully lived and died and among them, those who have marked our lives in particular ways.

Next Sunday, there will be an opportunity during the service for each member of the congregation who would like to, to light a candle and remember a person who has died, recently or longer ago, who has played an important part in your own life (silently, or by saying a person's name aloud). So please come with a person's name in mind if you'd like to take the opportunity to remember them during worship next Sunday, in what's perhaps a more intentional way than we usually do in Church.



"Big Issues": Thursday 27th October at Histon Methodist Church Nicky Newton, Community Fundraising Manager at Addenbrooke's Hospital will give a talk entitled "From Leeches to Laser" marking the hospital's 250th Anniversary. It starts at 7.30pm.

"Faith to Live By": One Woman's Ministry – beyond the Church Revd. Joy Levine will reflect on her fifty years of experience and challenge, two ordinations, and work in many sectors. Haslingfield Methodist Church, next Sunday (30th October) at 6.30pm.

Letter Cutting Movement - Monday 24th October at Wesley Church

An illustrated lecture by Lida Kindersley, letter cutter, stone carver and type designer, tomorrow evening (Monday 24th October) at Wesley Methodist Church, starting at 7.45pm (with refreshments from 7pm). The lecture is part of the Cambridge "Festival of Ideas" whose theme this year is "Movement".

In her talk Lida Kindersley explores letter cutting as an artistic movement and opens up the photographic archive of the Cardozo Kindersley Workshop that stretches back to the 1930s, providing a rare insight into the prolific and varied body of work from the workshop, based nearby on Victoria Road. Lida is currently working on the college crest and entrance gates which will soon be installed in the new buildings at Wesley House.

An Exhibition tracing the evolution of letter cutting in the Kindersley Workshop over the past seventy years will be displayed in the church for three days – Saturday, Sunday and Monday – leading up to the lecture. No tickets are required for the lecture. There will be a retiring collection, to be donated to the Wesley House Bursary Fund.
