Karunai Illam Ministries Silver Jubilee, 23rd June

Yesterday, Karunai Illam Ministries in India (our Centenary Charity, also supported by donations at Ruth and Martin's wedding) celebrated twenty-five years since its foundation. At last they have managed to get regular visits by a mobile health care team from a mission hospital, the Scudder Memorial Hospital in Ranipet, linked with the Christian Medical College Hospital. Tailoring and handicraft classes are enabling the people to supplement their income. A toilet has been added, plus larger ventilators in the walls to make the building cooler.
