### **Storey's Way House Group**

We resume the Friday night house group at Storey's Way on Friday (26th April). We will be looking at Henri Nouwen's *The Return of the Prodigal Son*, a story of homecoming, focussing on Rembrandt's painting.

It may more aptly be called the story of the forgiving father and raises issues like loneliness and what it is that our deepest self searches for. We will explore and share together some of the most powerful images of God from our childhood and whether these images prove to be helpful or not. We will also look at why some of us find it hard to accept God's forgiveness. We may explore feelings of anger and resentment and what it is to feel unappreciated. How does a forgiving and accepting father relate to our understanding of God? In the final session we will think about celebration. Celebration belongs to God's kingdom. Are we willing to join the celebration? What does this mean?

We will meet at 7.30pm as usual, and fortnightly – so the other dates will be 10th and 24th May, and 7th and 21st June (though we may need to change one of the dates in May).
