#### **CBM donation**

Castle Street has donated £278.31 to the CBM (former Christian Blind Mission) "See Our Way" appeal for funds to support its work in preventing blindness and transforming lives where the need is greatest; currently the focus is in Rwanda. Because our donation has been made before 14th May, it will be doubled by the UK Government. Our donation was made up of £200 from the Wednesday coffee mornings, £66.31 from the Easter Breakfast and £12 of gift aid from the breakfast.

The headquarters of CBM (UK) is on Oakington Business Park. Kirsty Smith, formerly worshipping at Sturton Street and briefly at Castle Street, has been the Chief Executive since 2012.
