“Exploring the Old Testament and its World”: Tyndale House day conference

A day of teaching from Tyndale House scholars, investigating the languages and historical context of the Old Testament, and its journey from the ancient to the modern world. It’s taking place on Saturday 22nd June at Christ Church, Cambridge, from 10am to 4.15pm, and is open to anyone with an interest in the Bible – no academic experience or qualifications are necessary.

The sessions will be:

- The Siege of Jerusalem: watching a biblical event through the eyes of Israel’s enemies (Dr Caleb Howard)
- Letter by letter: how the scribes preserved the text of the Old Testament (Dr Kim Phillips)
- A living language: tracking Old Testament Hebrew through time and space (Dr Elizabeth Robar)
- Moral depth: a modern reader’s guide to Old Testament narratives (Dr Peter J Williams)

Job advert (1): Centre Manager for St Philip's Church

Working as part of a core staff team, this role is to provide a welcoming Christian presence in St Philip's Church Centre including its Café, to manage the operations including marketing, communications with volunteers, room hirers and other interested parties, liaising with Church personnel, and taking financial responsibilities managing a sizeable budget. The job also includes oversight of policies, office systems including IT, building maintenance and the supervision of cleaning / caretaking services. An important element of this role involves inspiring and coordinating volunteers to help run the Church Centre.

Hours are about 25 hours per week, the annual salary is between £24,000 and £27,000 (depending on experience), and there are 25 days of annual leave (both pro rata). The successful candidate will identify as a Christian, being able to actively contribute to the aims, values and ethos of the Church bringing passion to the role. Being part of St Philip's fellowship will be important to this role.
