## **Changes ahead for the Cambridge Methodist Circuit**

Two changes in the ministerial staffing of the Cambridge Circuit have been announced this week. First, Revd Simon Oliver has been appointed as a Chaplain to Addenbrooke's Hospital, effective from 1st April 2020. He will therefore be stepping down from his role at Histon Methodist Church from that date, although he has committed to continuing to work towards a transition or positive ending of "The Roost" at Cottenham and other aspects of the ministry there. Revd Alison Walker will take temporary pastoral charge at Histon from 1st April until the end of the current Connexional year on 31st August, while Deacon Ian Murray will oversee circuit involvement at Cottenham, in liaison with Simon.

Meanwhile, Revd Colin Smith has confirmed his intention to reduce his re-invitation period from four years to two, and to vacate his role as Circuit Superintendent and Wesley Minister in September 2022.

Starting immediately, and against this background, the Circuit Leadership Team will instigate a comprehensive Strategic Review of future options, challenges and resources.

The Cambridge Churches Homelessness Project has received significant donations from these events, and CamCRAG has been a wonderful supporter of CCHP.

This year's is the third of these sleep-outs, and it's taking place on the night of Saturday 15th February. Volunteers are needed to be sponsored to sleep rough for the night, either inside the church, outside in a tent, or outside under a tarpaulin. An evening meal and breakfast will be provided. Money raised will support the work of CamCRAG in northern France and CCHP in Cambridge.
